Thankfully we have had no major issues since the earthquake. Several contributions have been received to help Harvest Christian Fellowship and Pastor Bobby Jones. The breakup has revealed some more issues. We hope to have a final estimate of repairs soon, and I hope others will help us finish the work there. Pastor Will Asaivao reports that the damage in their rental building was more extensive than first thought. The Jesus Is Lord congregation will need to relocate for several months during construction. Their financial needs are much smaller than Harvest Christian, but we certainly could use some assistance during this transitional time.

The Arctic Fest leadership team led by Keith Greene again provided a fantastic event for our students. Pastor Rob Miskowski powerfully shared the gospel, and Pastor Kyle Quinn and the music team from Unashamed Youth Ministries were just amazing. I also wanted to thank all of the Pastors and Youth Leaders for assuring our students were able to participate.

Again, I wanted to encourage **EVERY PASTOR AND MINISTER** to join us for a historic Summer Conference (Camp Meeting) and Global Forum with Presiding Bishop Dr. Tim Hill, and Assistant General Overseer Dr. Raymond Culpepper. **The Global Forum will take place Friday, May 10 from 1:00 to 4:00pm. NATIVE BREAKTHROUGH 2019

God put a burden for the people of Saxman Southeast Alaska in the Anniskettes' hearts many years ago. This is a small village of 106 homes with 406 people who live a few miles south of Ketchikan, Alaska.

Glen Anniskette, is a native to Southeast Alaska. He was saved as a teenager and called to preach. Bishop Bill & Margaret White, now pastors emeritus at the Lighthouse Church of God in Ketchikan, Alaska, mentored him for several years. Glen has carried a burden to see his fellow natives take up the cross and win the lost for the Lord Jesus Christ.

Glen and his wife, Susie, felt the green light to sponsor a Native Breakthrough in Saxman, Alaska in February 12-17, 2019 and God made it happen. They flew in Pastors Dennis & Cheryl Thomas from Manuelito, NM to help in this endeavor.

The Lighthouse Church of God, with Pastor Jeff White, was invaluable in helping this mission become a reality including the donation of a soundboard to the Saxman Community Center.

God showed His sense of humor when He opened the door for them to be interviewed on the local country radio station. Michelle O'Brien drilled the Anniskettes for almost an hour and allowed them to not only advertise the upcoming Native Breakthrough but prompted the conversation to include the gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! The day before the meetings began, a prayer walk was hosted by locals Jeremy Crews and Patti Green. Twelve met at the historic schoolhouse (now converted into a coffee house and offices for the Organized Village of Saxman) and drove (the cold temperatures and ice prevented them from walking) the village as they prayed. Pastor Jeff White braved the cold and ice and walked. Patti Green, Ron & Carol Towne went door to door in the village inviting natives to come.

The Anniskettes were blessed to acquaint themselves with the President of the IRA Tribe of Saxman and his wife, Lee & Winona Wallace who attended almost every service and were a great asset in helping with the meetings.

Snow prevailed the first night of the meetings which prevented some attendees from coming out, but God met with those who ventured out and met the needs of many.

The cold weather and other town activities continued throughout the week but people from different parts of the island and various denominations came to worship the Lord regardless.

The last service was held at the only church in Saxman where Pastor Dennis Thomas gave his powerful testimony, his wife, Cheryl testified and sang wonderful songs in Navajo and English, and Bishop John Steinberg's family bought the house down with their songs to the Lord. Bishop Glen Anniskette brought the word reminding everyone that they need to be renewed, restored and revived.

A final activity for the Native Breakthrough was the potluck which offered delicious native food mixed with good old favorites around the globe which was headed up by Joann Barsic.

The Anniskettes know that God has begun a new work in Saxman. They said, "you don't always see what God is doing inside a mission but be assured that His work will be accomplished when you obey Him!"


